Why a strong seed regulatory program?

- Louisiana is primarily a seed importing state
- Ensure that seed meets label guarantees and quality standards
- Bottom Line...Prevents Louisiana from becoming a dumping ground for low quality seed

Regulatory Seed Sampling & Testing

- Regulatory samples are taken by LDAF inspectors from seed offered for sale
- Seed is tested for both purity & germination quality
- As a result... < 3% of regulatory samples non-compliant

Louisiana State Seed Testing Laboratory

- Only seed testing laboratory in Louisiana approx. 7,500 samples/year
- Provides a wide range of testing services on agricultural, vegetable, lawn and tree seeds
- Regulatory Testing
- Service Testing Service fee basis
 - Seed ID
 - Germination/Seed Vigor
 - Purity
 - Seed Counts
 - Herbicide Resistance
 - Noxious Weed Seed

Seed Germination vs. Seed Vigor

- Seed Germination Test "evaluation of the seed properties that allow emergence and development of a seedling under favorable field conditions"
- Seed Vigor Test "evaluation of the seed properties that allow rapid field emergence and development of a seedling under a wide range of field conditions"
- Seed Vigor Tests *Examples*
 - Accelerated Aging High heat and humidity (soybeans, sorghum, others)
 - *Texas Cool Test* Extended uninterrupted period of constant cool temperature (*cotton*)
 - Others

Seed Vigor Testing

The good and the bad of it all...

- Provides seedling information directly related to field emergence and performance
- Unfortunately, vigor tests for many agricultural crops do not currently exist
- Vigor tests are seldom requested by growers
- However, AOSA standard germination tests provide somewhat of a "seed vigor" component
 - <u>Seedling must contain all vital parts for seedling</u> <u>survival, and those parts proportionate and</u> <u>healthy</u>

Louisiana State Seed Testing Laboratory

Overview

 Provides a mechanism to ensure that a reliable source of high quality seed from superior new crop varieties is available to Louisiana producers.



- Provides a wide range of services that aid seed growers in the production, identification, distribution, and promotion of new and improved crop varieties.
- Integral step for the Foundation Seed Programs to release new and improved crop varieties to Louisiana growers.

Why Seed Certification?

- New varieties of agricultural crops are being developed and rapidly released to commercial seed producers and their customers.
 - But...the value of these new crop varieties rapidly decreases when genetic purity is lost
- Seed Certification is a documented system designed to maintain varietal purity (and other important factors) in seed and preserve the value of new varieties - from planting through packaging.


Structure

- AOSCA Association of Official Seed Certification Agencies
 - National (International) Seed Certification Agency
 - Maintains minimum crop certification standards that are followed by all participating certification agencies
- Louisiana Department of Agriculture & Forestry
 - Agency of authority in LA
 - Certify approx. 10,000 acres annually
 - ✓ All major agricultural crops
 - ✓ Vegetables
 - ✓ Turf/Pasture grasses
 - ✓ Trees
 - Native plant species

Certified Seed

"... is the highest quality seed available to growers that contains superior production potential as defined by several important factors"

- □ Known genetic source, identity and seed origin
- High genetic purity
- High germinating potential
- Minimum amount of other crop seed, weed and inert matter
- Known presence or absence of seed-borne diseases
- Free of noxious weeds and harmful insects


Seed Quality Testing

- Seed examinations are specific to crop being certified
 - Purity analysis
 - ✓ Seed ID
 - ✓ Varietal purity
 - ✓ Weed seed
 - ✓ Other crop seed
 - ✓ Inert matter
 - Noxious weed seed

Seed Quality Testing

- Germination analysis
 - ✓ Germination percentage
 - Alternate tests upon request...
 - Seed vigor
 - Seed viability







- Bulk seed or vegetative propagated plant material
 - Bulk certificate
- Containerized seed
 - Certified label

Certified Seed Processing Facilities

- Approval by LDAF
- Facility inspected yearly
 - Equipment on hand to adequately process seed kind
 - Ability to thoroughly clean facility to avoid seed contamination
 - Adequate storage capacity to maintain integrity of seed lots
 - Complete processing records of all seed lots



Records Auditing

- Designated individual responsible for certification
- Records must be kept on all certified seed lots
- Documentation to ensure seed identity throughout entire certification process_
- Available for inspection by LDAF

Plant Breeder Approval

- Required for any plant breeder growing, developing or supervising the production of breeder seed
- Application to LDAF
 - Specific qualifications required
- Applicant approval by Commission
