The National FFA Organization makes a positive difference in the lives of students by developing their potential for premier leadership, personal growth and career success through agricultural education.


- FFA is the largest Career and Technical Student Organization (CTSO) in the United States

- Based on the three-circle model of education




WHAT IS THE SCOPE OF AGRICULTURAL EDUCATION IN LOUISIANA?

- Over 25,000 students in grades 7-12
 - One of the largest CTE programs in the state
 - 20% membership growth since 2016
 - Over 11,300 of these students are FFA members
- 203 programs in 51 parishes
 - Urban, suburban, and rural
 - Programs in Monroe, Alexandria, Lake Charles, Lafayette, Baton Rouge with interest in Shreveport and New Orleans
- Blends academic and technical education
- Fully integrated with Jump Start
 - IBCs in AgriTech, Forestry, and NCCER Welding, Carpentry, and Electrical




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Student Enrollment by Gender



AGRICULTURAL EDUCATION CURRICULUM

- AgriTech is based on Agriscience I, II, and III
 - These courses include:
 - Mechanics (welding, small engines, electricity)
 - Animal science
 - Plant and soil science
 - Environmental science
 - Entomology
 - Food science
 - Business management and marketing
 - Leadership



AGRICULTURAL EDUCATION IS ESSENTIAL

- Directly training the state's future workforce
- Less time for turnover
 - A workforce already equipped with the fundamental knowledge and skills to be successful
- 3,000 students graduate from the program each year
- Teaches combination of technical and soft skills
 - Leadership, time management, character, dependability, work ethic
